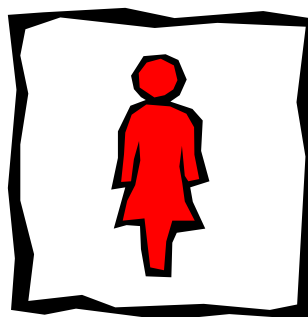

of MetLife Foundation and Libraries for the Future, the program division of Americans for Libraries Council.



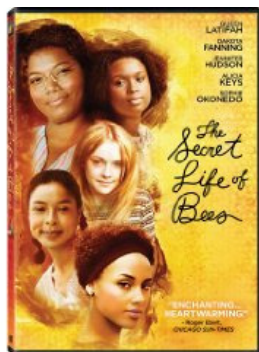
## Star Readers
