Storytelling, dance, song, and more, featuring some of the Chester's gifted young adults.

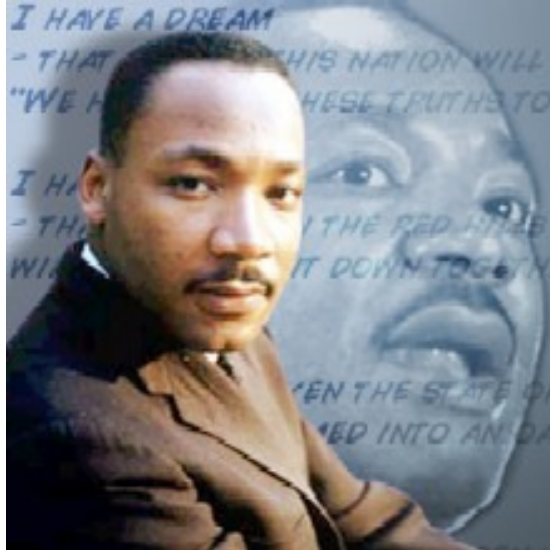


Save the Date: Only the Ball Was White Sat., Feb. 27th, 11am

Requirements for essay contest (no exceptions):

Essays must be submitted no later than 1/15/2010

Participants must state at least 5 short facts about Martin Luther King

Essays must be typed or handwritten only (cursive writing will not be accepted)

All essays must be legible (if we cannot read the essay it will not be accepted)

Essays must be at least 5 paragraphs long and cannot exceed one page
